#### **EDITORIAL**

#### SBIPA-A KEY TO GOOD HEALTH TOO

In present day's material world.everyone expects good returns in lieu of amount paid as membership. This may be the reason for over 60% of the pensioners not subscribing to membership. In our circle only 30% of pensioners/family pensioners have become our members. Taking into account the membership with 3 e SBOP pensioners Associations, the membership does not exceed 40%. Barring 1-2 circles, the position is almost the same everywhere. It has, therefore, become necessary to tell the members about the work being undertaken by the Association for its members.

The association is continuously working for ensuring

justice to all the pensioners. The efforts have resulted in enhancement in family pension from 15% to 30%.

The DA anomaly removed for pre Nov2002 retirees and 50% of basic for all, irrespective of cadre and without ceiling, achieved.

The efforts resulted in getting best health insurance policy for

pensioners at a competitive premium. And our office bearers have been helping the pensioners on day to day basis for getting medical bills paid and ensuring hassle free cash less treatment, where ever available.

Expeditious settlement of stagnation increments, pension fixation, release of family pension and other issues pertaining to pre and post retirement.

The association is working hard to ensure establishment



of dispensaries at all big centres, tie up with path labs for cash less tests and increase in budget for medicines at bank's dispensaries.

The association is committed to help the pensioners having children with mental or physical disabilities to be included as family pensioners.

Above all, monthly meetings and excursion tours organised by our units provide them an opportunity to rejuvenate.

These are the few of the services provided to make the life of pensioners tension free.

How ever, there are invisible indirect benefits one gets after joining the association.

On retirement, bank releases terminal benefits but all of a sudden one finds himself isolated as he has to leave his friends and colleagues, the status and the company of clients. Moreover, at this stage generally the children are settled and living their own life at another place. This is really the stage of loneliness .

It is estimated that 50% of individuals over 60 years of age are at the risk of social isolation and 35% will experience the same degree of isolation later in life.

Evidences reveal that social isolation and loneliness hinders good health putting elders at risk of high BP,heart problems, obesity,week immune system, anxiety, depression, cognitive decline, Alzheimer's disease etc.

Experts have proven that socialization amongst the senior citizens not only keeps the brain sharp but also decreases the risks of developing aforementioned diseases. Besides, it improves mental health and increases sense of belonging. It also increases self esteem and provides a purposeful living.

The recent research suggests that the elders must join NGOs/associations of elders for maintaining good



physical and mental health.

As such by joining SBIPA, one gets all theses benefits thereby proving that SBIPA is key to good health too.

In the light of the above, we call upon our office bearers and active members to motivate their non member pensioner/family pensioner friends to join the the assiciation to keep them healthy and make our association strong enough to work for the welfare of pensioners with full vigour and enthusiasm.

## REMBS/POLICY A & HEALTH ASSIST POLICY B DEFICIENCIES IN SERVICE BY SBI GENERAL AND TPAS

We are compelled to raise the issues of unsatisfactory services being rendered by the captioned companies to SBI PENSIONERS.

After the takeover of RAKSHA TPA by Medi assist a mess has been created, M/S Raksha TPA is showing least interest in serving their past clients, whereas M/S Medi assist is taking time in understanding the issues. Many bills are pending for quite a long time, including those where the policy holders have attended to the queries raised by Raksha TPA. M;S Raksha TPA has not updated the information received by them/documents submitted by the affected policy holders thereby compelling them to wait indefinitely and remain out of pocket for a long. The details of pending cases was brought to the notice of both these companies but in vain as they do not consider it fit to respond to our communications. The previous TPA has lost interest in SBI Pensioners and the bills submitted by them before 15/01/24 are not been considered by them for payment. These are either being returned on flimsy grounds or kept pending unnecessarily. The new TPA has not yet understood the problems of pensioners. Ultimately, the sufferers are SBI Pensioners.

Further, M/S Medi assist assured to provide acknowledgement immediately on receipt of bills but now they seem to have lost interest and are not adhering to their own words.

The deficiencies found in bills/rejection of bills are not being intimated to the claimants.

The welcome kits with details of affiliated hospitals/claim forms /IDs has not been received by the policy holders till date.

The policy document containing terms of agreement are not being sent o the policy holders Moreover, Mediassist has not posted any senior executive at Chandigarh to take care of the needs of large number of policy holders of Chandigarh Circle which has also added to the woes of pensioners.

The pensioners bought health insurance policies to enjoy healthy and tension free post retirement life. But the attitude of all these companies made their lives miserable.

We, very humbly, request you to take up the matter with concerned authorities and save Our Pensioners Fraternity From Unwanted Mental Agony And Financial Hardship.

# PHYSICALLY CRIPPLED AND MENTALLY CHALLENGED CHILDREN OF PENSIONERS RIGHT TO FAMILY PENSION- SERVICE TO MANKING IS SERVICE TO GOD

On our request, the bank has agreed to provide a special chance to allow addition of names of disabled children as family pensioners and constituted a medical board to ascertain the percentage of disability to ensure their eligibility. The medical board examined these cases and submitted the report to bank for further suitable action in he matter. Our aim was to help such pensioners who were very much disturbed due to alarming condition of their children and worried about their future.

It took lot of time effort and money on the part of pensioners to complete those formalities. Please imagine the frustration agony and harassment caused by such negligence.

We were made to understand that those who were called

to present their children for examination by the bank's constituted board were otherwise eligible. However, to our surprise, the bank has started raising queries and demanding documents in piecemeal manner, thereby making their life miserable.

Now they have been asked to furnish Following information

- Proof pertaining to disabilitys disability in addition to certificate viz, proof pf admission in a school for specially disabled or record of treatment
- 2. Non declaration of disability during service.
- 3. PAN or form 26 AS to be provided if it is available
- 4. Last six months account statement.

The above are the fresh documents required You can well understand harassment. agony and frustration caused due to such piecemeal queries.

Further, in case those called for medical examination were not found eligible, they should have been straight way told the truth instead of keeping them busy in completing numerous formalities one after the other for over a year and wasting their precious time and money. Kindly look into the matter and arrange to add the names

Kindly look into the matter and arrange to add the names of those who appeared before the medical board, subject to disability confirmation by the board, in PPO as family pensioners and save them from further mental agony.

E-VENDORS-UR LIFE

**UNSATISFACTORY SERVICES** 

We are extremely thankful to the bank management for agreeing to our request and providing the pensioners an opportunity to select one of the four e-vendors at the time of renewal of Policy B this year. Since, the pensioners were not happy with the services of tata1mg and medibuddy and were appreciative of the services of UR WORLD (Appolo pharmacy) who were earlier rendering good services, most of them opted for URLIFE (APOLLO PHARMACY).

However, to our utter dismay, their services this time are far from satisfactory because:-

- 1. They are refusing to supply the prescribed medicines on the pretext not in stocks.
- 2. Insulin, the much required injection for diabetics and not available with bank's dispensaries, is always out

of stocks.

- 3. They are not adjusting subsidy payable by the bank in some of the cases in one pretext or the other.
- 4. A few of the policy B holders are also complaining of nonreceipt of agreed discount on all medicines ordered by them.
- 5. Earlier, they were allowing purchase of 'over the counter' medicines as they are having lot many outlets all over the country. This facility has now been withdrawn by them on the pretext that Bank does not allow supply of medicines covered under OTC
- 6. Their invoices don't show amount of discount and Bank subsidy separately. Kindly take up the matter with e vendors through corporate centre for an early resolution so that the policy B holders are not compelled to suffer financial loss this year.
