#### GENERAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

#### WELCOME

Mr President and esteemed members of SBIPA, Chandigarh circle –It gives me immence pLeasure to welcome you all to the 37<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting of SBIPA, Chandigarh Circle being held today i.e 21<sup>st</sup> April,2024 in one of the best auditoriums of Chandigarh-BABA MAKHAN SHAH LUBANA BHAWAN, SECTOR 30A Chandigarh.

#### CONDOLENCES

We offer our heartfelt condolences to the families of those who have left us during the period 05/06/2022 to 15/04/2024. Pensioners Mail, our regular quarterly magazine has been publishing the names of our members/spouse in obituary column. Shri T L Mittal, our Moga unit secretary was amongst those who left for their heavenly abode during the period. Shri D N Gosh, former chairman SBI, S Bishan Singh Bedi, Cricketer, S Parkash Singh Badal, former chief minister Punjab Shri Raju Srivastav, renowned comedian Shri Pankaj Udhas, Gazal Singer, M S Swaminathan, renowned scientist, Shri M R Awasthi and Shri L V Subramanium trade union leaders of banking industry are a few of the personalities who left us during the period. We also condole the death of defence personnel and para military forces who sacrificed their lives for the sake of our motherland.

Let us observe one minute silence in their memory.

#### **POLITICAL DEVELOPMENTS**

The election commission of India has declared general elections to the Indian Parliament, the Largest Democracy of the World. The elections will be held in seven stages and the results will be declared on 4<sup>th</sup> june,2024. This time the contest is mostly between NDA and INDI alliance barring a few states like West Bengal, Telangana, Punjab and Odisa where the local parties are not a part of any alliance. I appeal to all the members to exercise their right to franchise and elect the right person to govern our country.

#### **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTS**

Despite worldwide slow down, India has maintained its ecomomic growth. The world bank has revised its GDP to over 7% for the financial year 23-24. India is set to be the world"s third largest economy within the next 6 years. All appreciations to work force of Banking Industry as the banks are the backbone of Indian economy.

#### **DEVELOPMENTS AT APEX LEVEL**

With the efforts made by our federation, many of the pending issues could be resolved during the period;-

- a) **DA anomaly-** Those retired before November 2002 were being deprived of 100% DA neutralization for long. This anomaly stands removed and the eligible pensioners are now being paid enhanced DA.
- b) 40%-50% anomaly- The anomaly was depriving officers scale 2 and above the pension @ 50% of last drawn basic for a long. This also stand removed with the intervention of court in response to a plaint filed by our federation and others. While others are claiming credit for this achievement, but without the presentation made by our federation, it could not have been possible. Hence the role of FSBIPA for this great

achievement must be appreciated by one and all. The arrears w ef Nov 2023 have been paid to most of the eligible pensioners. Rest will be paid during the month of April, 2024.

- c) **Pension Updation-** Our federation has decided to take up the issue with all sincerity so as to provide much needed relief to the pensioners.
- d) **Ex Gratia-** The 12<sup>th</sup> bipartite settlement has provided for an ex gratia payment to all the old pensioners, without having any impact on the demand for pension updation. As such our crusade for pension updation will continue till we achieve it.the arrears wef 1/11/22 are expected to be paid to the eligible pensioner during the month of april,2024
- e) **SBI Salute-** During AMRUT MAHOTASAVA, the bank has paid a one time ex gratia payment to all those who attained the age of 75 years on or before 31<sup>st</sup> August 2023.
- f) **SBI created history** Buoyed by relentless pursuit of best policies and stretegies across niche segments and the hard work done by staff as well as the solid base made by pensioners, the standalone net profit during FY 2023 rose by over 58% to 50232 crores This is the highest profit by any listed corporate domestically. We congratulate the bank and are sure that the bank will initiate more welfare measures for staff pensioners.
- g) **ROLE OF UFBU-** The UFBU under the leadership of com Sanjeev Bandlish has become more vibrant and result oriented. The 12<sup>th</sup> bipartite settlement, which has been the best ever since the bipartisan started in the banking industry, is a clear evidence of my contention. The best increase in pay package in the least possible time and that too without any agitation or strike action. Moreover, it is for the first time that the staff pensioners also received attention as they have been paid ex gratia without disturbing the demand for updating of pension. The role of UFBU in the settlement of DA disparity issue of pre November 2002 retirees are commendable and needs to be appreciated by one and all.

#### **KUDOS TO AISBOF**

All India State Bank Officers Federation under the leadership of Comrade Rupam Roy and Deepak Kumar Sharma also scaled new heights. The role played by the federation in getting 40%- 50% pension disparities settled will be written in golden letters.

#### **CHAIRMAN'S ROLE**

The role of our Chairman Shri Dinesh Kumar Khara has been praiseworthy. In the matter of SBI SALUTE, settlement of DA Parity and 40%-50% pension disparity he played a very phenomenal role. SBIPA appreciates such gestures and hope that in future also the pensioners will get similar favour from bank's top management-which they deserve too.

#### **CIRCLE LEVEL DEVELOPMENTS**

a) Membership- It is shocking to note that our circle with 23078(as on 31/03/24)

Pensioners/family pensioners have just around 7500 members of SBIPA. My enquiries with PPG Department revealed that over 4000 pensioners are inactive i.e. they are not being paid pension due to one reason or the other. As such total pensioners who are members of any of the associations are 50% of the total strength of active members. To our satisfaction, out of these 9500 members, our association i.e. SBIPA Chandigarh Circle has 80%s membership..

My earnest appeal to all the associations floated by eSBOP pensioners to join hands with us in the interest of all the pensioners and fight for their rights unitedly. I appeal to all the members to motivate their friends to

join SBIPA Chandigarh Circle. We will be happy to have 100% strength of the total active pensioners/family pensioners.

- b) **LHO DISPENSARY-** SBIPA has been able to resolve the problems relating to dispensary at local Head Office. .The behavior of Doctors towards retirees has undergone a sea change. They are more polite, compassionate and sympathetic. The medicines are now dispensed for two months to all. Three months to seriously ill and above 80 years of age. Also those going out of station are getting the medicines for three months; the timings have been extended up to 5 pm.
- c) **STRUCTURED MEETINGS** We are happy to inform that bank is convening structured meetings regularly and all the issues brought to our notice by our members are not only discussed but resolved immediately. We have been able to get the dispensaries established at various centres and trying to have at all RBO centres. Arrangements with Path labs for cashless services for pensioners at all big centre is our priority. The budget for purchase of medicines for bank's dispensaries has been increased, wherever found inadequate.
- d) **STAGNATION INCREMENT** our team is actively following up the matter and ensuring payment of stagnation increment to all the eligible pensioners.
- e) **REVISED PPOs** We are ensuring that revised PPOs to all are sent on priority basis.
- f) **GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL PROGRAM** - The latest initiative by the bank aimed at finding solutions to the staff pensioners is going well with the pensioners. During the program, the pensioners are duly supported by our local representatives. In LHO, the president and general Secretary along with other locally available office bearers are invariably present to provide moral support to those coming with issues. However, at certain centres, the seriousness is not attached and the staff not competent enough to handle the issues is deputed to attend to the grievances of pensioners. We have apprised the circle management and have been assured that the bank will take care of our feedback in future.
- g) **PROGRAM FOR RETIRING STAFF** On our request, the bank has resumed the Program after a long gap and now this is being regularly organized at SBILD Panchkula.. The President, general secretary and the locally available office bearers ensure their presence to apprise the participants about the working of association, the benefits of joining SBIPA as well as the do's and don'ts after retirement. It provides us an opportunity to enroll new member
- h) **eSBOP ISSUES** With a view to resolving eSBOP pensioners' issues, we requested the management to convene a small committee meeting to discuss these issues and have a satisfactory resolution. The bank had agreed and the date was also fixed but owing to kissan agitation, the meeting could not take place. We hope to reschedule the meeting shortly.
- i) **MEETINGS WITH TPA-** Thanks to the bank for arranging regular interaction with representatives of TPA & M/S Anand Rathi Brokers. Since CDO and officials from PPG Department conduct such meetings, we are able to find solutions to a lot many issues.
- j) **ePHARMACY ISSUES** Despite strenuous efforts by us, our federation and the bank, the problems still exist with all the four e vendors. We are working tirelessly to ensure proper service to policy B holders. We are hopeful that the vendors will improve their services at the earliest

#### k) SBI HEALTH ASSIST

Despite best efforts by our representatives, only 26% of the pensioners/family pensioners came forward to join health insurance policy B this year. We vouch that this is the best health policy provided by SBI at very reasonable premium and the

Pensioners need to be motivated to buy it to have a financial security against

medical emergencies We take pride in getting a large number of long pending bills settled, reducing the time taken in getting admission and discharge at the hospitals and getting the bills paid to the satisfaction of pensioners

Another achievement which is the most important relates to payment of balance amount of medical bill once the limit in policy B exhausts from REMBS and staff welfare fund.

#### I) MEETINGS

Most of our units are holding regular monthly meetings with good participation by members. They are arranging religious and excursion tours, celebrating birth days/ anniversaries and updating the members on all the issues concerning them. Medical camps/ talks by famous doctors benefitting members are a regular feature. We appeal to the members to form units, wherever not yet formed, and start activities beneficial to pensioners.

AGMs are also held at various centres. During the period, The circle office bearers headed by President and General Secreatry attended the AGMs at Jalandhar, Bhatinda, Karnal, Palampur, Panipat and Shimla. We appeal to all big centres to

organize General Body meetings and we will be happy to join them

#### m) MEMBERSHIP NUMBERS

We are issuing distinctive membership number to each of the members. All are

requested to refer the same while corresponding with the association. This number will be useful for the smooth conduct of elections too in future. We will try to hold online elections in future to save the members from avoidable fatique.

#### n) MWS SCHEME

Another area of concern for pensioners is not availability of funds in MWS which depletes the chances of payment of family pension and also medical bells.. Our constant follow up has helped in improving the position to a great extent and we will continue our efforts to ensure benefits to all Mutual Welfare Scheme Scheme subscribers.

#### RELATIONSHIP WITH WORKING ORGANISATIONS

At Circle Level, we are enjoying excellent fraternal relations. We are regularly meeting Shri Sanjay Sjharma, General Secretary and Shri Priya Vrat, President of SBIOA Chandigarh Circle. We also make it a point to visit Shri Sanjeev Bandlish, General Secretary SBISA Chandigarh Circle whenever he is available. We are fortunate to meet Com Deepak Sharma, General Secretary, AISBOF regularly and seek his help wherever required.

#### AMENDMENTS TO RULES AND BYE LAWS OF ASSOCIATION

- 8 It is resolved to demand LFC, as available in many of the state governments, to SBI Staff pensioners.
- 9 It is resolved to demand Review of DA payable to pensioners on quarterly basis instead of half yearly basis.
- 10 It is resolved to demand allowing mentally challenged and physically crippled children of pensioners to enroll as family pensioners, even if the disability is detected /Occurred after retirement.
- To demand staff plus senior citizens rate of interest on SBIPA deposits held with SBI as the SBIPA represents the bank's pensioners who are obviously senior citizens
